



CLAN DRUMMOND



James Drummond
2nd Duke of Perth
1674 - 1720



After he was exiled, his two sons, **James** and **John** were raised by their mother **Lady Jean**, a fierce Jacobite patriot, who was imprisoned in Edinburgh Castle for most of 1746. Lady Jean is an important character in all three books of the Song for a Lost Kingdom series.

The Drummond brothers attended Scots College, Doal in France, spending most of their teenage years in France. When James returned home he became interested in science, agricultural and breeding of race horses. He planned the town of Crieff and a new settlement at Callander nearly Stirling.

James Drummond is a key character of Book I and II and is introduced briefly in the Prequel.

John Drummond, his younger brother, was a natural soldier. He joined the French army as an officer and reached the rank of Captain in the Irish Brigade's Regiment Roth. We meet John in Book II.

CLAN CARNEGIE



James Carnegie
5th Earl of Southesk
1692 - 1730

Clan Carnegie were also mostly Jacobites. The 5th Earl, **James Carnegie**, followed the Old Pretender during the Jacobite rising of 1715 and as a result was attained by an Act of Parliament and his Kinnaird estates were forfeited to the Crown. The Earl is introduced in the Prequel as a teenager.

After the Earl's death, his widow **Lady Margaret**, fought to retain Kinnaird. She remarried **John St Clair**, a long-time Jacobite patriot who fought in 1715. Both Lady Margaret and John St Clair appear in all three books.



Sir James Carnegie
3rd Baronet
1715-1765

When the 5th Earl died without issue (children) his line passed to John Carnegie of Pittarrow, descended from a younger son of the first Earl of Southesk. John had died a year earlier, so his son, **Sir James Carnegie**, inherited the Earl's titles and estate. **Sir James** is a prominent figure in Books I and II. He was a Captain in the British army and a member of parliament. He is introduced in Book I and plays a much larger role in Book II.

Sir James had a brother, **George Carnegie**, who fought against him in the 1745 uprising and ended up as a very successful man of business after fleeing to Sweden following the Battle of Culloden. George is featured in all three books.

Katharine Carnegie was one of the five 'unknown sisters' of Sir James and George. In the *Song for a Lost Kingdom* series, she is a composer and cellist. The cello she plays was created by **Robert Duncan** of Aberdeen in 1736. Katharine plays an important role in the Prequel and Book II.



HOUSE OF STUART

Originally 'Stewart,' this was a royal house of Scotland. Founded by Robert II, their Kings and Queens sat on the Scottish throne from 1371 until the union with England in 1707. Mary, Queen of Scots was brought to France in 1547 where she adopted the French spelling, 'Stuart.'



King James II / VII (England/Scotland) was deposed in 1688 in the Glorious Revolution as the last Roman Catholic monarch of the two countries. His belief in the divine right of kings was ultimately a great part of his undoing.

James Francis Edward Stuart

"The Old Pretender" **1688 - 1766**

James Francis Edward Stuart, son of the deposed King James II/VII was raised as a Catholic in Europe. When his father died in 1701 he claimed the crown in exile as James III/VIII. He was nicknamed 'The Old Pretender' during his failed attempt to lead the Jacobite Rising of 1715.




Charles Edward Stuart

Thirty years later his son, **Charles Edward Stuart,** took up his father's claim leading the Jacobite Rising of 1745 earning the much finer nickname 'Bonnie Prince Charlie.' The **Prince** is introduced in Book I and becomes a key figure in Book II.

HOUSE OF HANOVER



George II

King of Great Britain and Ireland

Elector of Hanover

1683 - 1760

It originated in 1635 as a branch of the German House of Brunswick-Lüneburg. In 1714, with the death of Anne, the last monarch of the House of Stuart, the crown passed to her cousin, George Ludwig of Hanover. He ascended the throne as George I – the first Hanoverian monarch of Great Britain.

George II was born in northern Germany and succeeded his father in 1727 as King of Great Britain and Elector of Hanover. He spent many summers in Germany and was estranged from his oldest son, Frederick, the Prince of Wales.

George's youngest son, **Prince William Augustus**, was born in Westminster, London. He was enrolled in the 2nd Foot Guards at the age of 4. As the leading British general by 1745, the Duke of Cumberland was tasked with stopping his cousin, Charles Edward Stuart, and the Stuart claim to the throne once and for all.

The Duke of Cumberland plays a key role in Book II.






